## MEET THE ARTISTS

---

**Harrison Kim** is a clarinetist currently in his fourth year of undergraduate study with Michael Wayne at the Eastman School of Music. He has been recognized in several competitions, earning honorable mention in both the Vandoren Emerging Artists and Yamaha Young Performing Artists competitions, and competing internationally at the 2024 International Clarinet Competition Ghent. He has performed under the batons of esteemed conductors including Esa-Pekka Salonen, Gustavo Dudamel, Benjamin Zander, and Delyana Lazarova. His orchestral experience includes performing side by side with The Cleveland Orchestra, serving as a member of the Texas Festival Orchestra at the Round Top Music Festival, and being an alumnus of the San Francisco Symphony Youth Orchestra. As a teacher, his students have gone on to successfully audition for the San Francisco Symphony Youth Orchestra as well as the California All-State Bands and Orchestras. Prior to his studies at Eastman, Harrison studied with Dr. Janet Averett, former professor at San José State University.

Violinist **Ingrid Buschkopf** has performed as a chamber musician and soloist on stages across the United States as well as in France, Mexico, and Korea through tours with the Fulton Music Society. She currently studies with Juliana Athayde at the Eastman School of Music, and her former teachers include Katherine Brooks at the String Academy of Wisconsin, and Addison Teng at the Fulton Summer Music Academy, where she was the inaugural recipient of the Sally G. Thomas Scholarship. She served as concertmaster of the Fulton Summer Music Academy and has performed with ensembles such as Fulton Chamber Players, Empires Film and Media Ensemble, and the Sirius Piano Trio.

**Christopher Tavernier** made his orchestral debut with the Tar River Philharmonic Orchestra at the age of thirteen, performing Tchaikovsky's Piano Concerto No. 1 in Bb Minor. Since then, he has won numerous awards and competitions throughout the Southeastern United States including 1st prize in the Florida MTNA Piano Competition's collegiate division.

In addition to being a solo performer, Christopher also has an avid interest in chamber music and consistently collaborates with other musicians in the Western North Carolina area. He works diligently and with the utmost professionalism and is lauded for his extreme sensitivity, especially in his collaborative work. Christopher obtained his Bachelors of Music from Florida State University and is currently pursuing his Masters of Music at the Eastman School of Music at the University of Rochester in New York. His teachers include John Cobb, Douglas Weeks, Read Gainsford, Rieko Aizawa, and Douglas Humpherys.
