

Anton Bruckner spent several decades as a schoolteacher and church musician near his home in northern Austria prior to his move to Vienna and his emergence as one of the greatest symphonists of the nineteenth century. The Mass in F, his final mass, was written at the time of his move to Vienna and coincided with the writing of his first symphonies. It was the work that introduced Bruckner, the new professor of organ and counterpoint at the Vienna Conservatory, to the Viennese public as a major compositional voice.

Although the Austrian Empire of Bruckner's day identified firmly with Catholic culture, it was largely a secular society. Bruckner, in contrast, was known for his extreme piety, frequently beginning his counterpoint lectures by kneeling in prayer, to the uneasiness and sometimes the ridicule of his students.

The Mass in F shares a number of characteristics with the mature symphonies that were to follow. It alternates sustained, sometimes static harmonies with colorful and surprising modulations to distant keys. It occasionally uses silence to clarify its form. It utilizes frequent brass fanfares and numerous complex contrapuntal passages. Most notably, Bruckner takes the major themes from the earlier movements and weaves them together to create the fabric of the final *Agnus Dei*, a technique seen in a number of the symphonies—perhaps in part as a tribute to the finale of Beethoven's Ninth.

Unlike some of the symphonies, the Mass in F found immediate acclaim, and after the early performances was compared to Beethoven's Missa Solemnis in its vocal challenges, its expansive length, and its inspiration.
